#### Dear Friends,

I am thrilled to share with you the exciting successes of Everyone Home DC in 2023, a year that was especially meaningful for me. As I celebrated my ten-year anniversary with the organization in November, I couldn't help but marvel at our remarkable growth and achievements over the past decade. From fewer than a dozen staff and a budget of less than one million dollars, we have expanded to nearly 40 staff and a budget of five-and-a-half million dollars. Along the way, we launched new programs, adopted a name that better reflects our mission, built development and operations teams, and survived a global pandemic. Through it all, we have remained steadfast in our commitment to ending homelessness and relentless in our advocacy for the individuals and families we work alongside every day.

In 2023, we were able to expand our programs to assist many more Washingtonians seeking safe and stable housing. We welcomed 24 families and 38 single adults into our new Permanent Supportive Housing Program, helped prevent homelessness for 567 families—a 38% increase from 2022—and more than doubled the number of families participating in our Rapid Rehousing Program. We also relaunched our Street Outreach Program and resumed and expanded our medical outreach partnership with Unity Healthcare.

To support our programs' growth, we significantly enhanced our leadership and infrastructure. We created a new Chief of Staff position and divided our Director of Programs role into two positions, one focusing on families and the other on single adults. We also established an Operations Department led by two of our most tenured staff and added two exceptional professionals to our Development and Communications department.

Our rapid growth and change in 2023 was one of the most challenging and impactful periods during my time with Everyone Home DC. But we are not done yet! In the fall, we were elated to receive the news that the Bezos Day 1 Families Fund had granted us our first-ever multi-year, multi-million dollar funding. This grant has opened up new opportunities to advance our strategic goals and support more families who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

This milestone accomplishment sparked joy in our staff, board, and all those who have been instrumental in our success over the years as volunteers, board members, donors, advisors, and partners. We were deeply moved by your congratulatory messages and tremendous outpouring of pride. Thank you for believing in us and investing in our shared mission to end homelessness. We look forward to keeping you updated on our progress as we put these new dollars to work in the months and years ahead!



## **Drop-in & Supportive Programs**

For Individuals

#### Day Center, Shirley's Place

- Drop-in Day Center offers individuals experiencing homelessness a safe and dignified place to spend their day off the street
- Open Monday through Thursday
- Showers, laundry, nutritious meals in partnership with DC Central Kitchen, mail service, and social services referrals
- A space to build relationships, community, and trust
- Crisis support

#### Street Outreach

- Teams deploy Monday through Friday
- Works with individuals experiencing homelessness in Capitol Hill
- Conducts housing-focused street outreach using a person-centered approach to build and maintain relationships
- Establishes trust, meets basic needs, and connects to community resources
- Supports achieving long-term goals, which includes obtaining stable housing, with the goal to help everyone move into permanent housing

# Single Adult Permanent Supportive Housing

- Works alongside single adults in scattered site long-term housing throughout the city
- Individuals experiencing chronic homelessness
- Housing is subsidized; a portion of income is paid toward rent
- Housing is combined with intensive case management services, regular home visits, and support in achieving health and wellness goals to maintain long-term stability

# **Family Housing Programs**

Access to family services comes through referrals from the Virginia Williams Family Resource Center, the central intake for DC's coordinated homelessness assistance system for families. In 2023, Everyone Home DC provided housing stability for 786 families.

#### **Family Homelessness Prevention**

- Prevents families on the verge of homelessness from entering the shelter system
- Offers housing stabilization services for families through mediation, flexible financial assistance, and connecting to supportive resources
- Support up to 90 days

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#### Family Permanent Supportive Housing

- Serves families in scattered site long-term housing throughout the city
- Families and individuals experiencing chronic homelessness and with a disabling condition
- Housing is subsidized; a portion of income is paid toward rent
- Housing is combined with intensive case management services, regular home visits, and support in achieving wellness goals to maintain long-term stability

#### Family Rapid Rehousing

- Serves 150 families in scattered site apartments throughout the city
- Helps families quickly move out of shelter and highly precarious housing into homes of their own
- Provides short-term rental and utility assistance, along with housingfocused case management and skills-based workshops
- Support up to 18 months

#### **ADA Accessible Shelter Units**

- Serves 4 families in ADA-accessible, apartment-style shelter units in NE and SE of DC
- Provides case management services during shelter stay and assists with transitioning into permanent housing

#### **Spring Social**

Everyone Home DC was honored to bring more than 70 friends together in May for its Spring Social held on the rooftop of Biergarten Haus. It was inspiring to be in the presence of people who share the vision of our city as a thriving and diverse place where all people can obtain and remain in safe, affordable, and comfortable homes. The Spring Social raised \$3,000, which Everyone Home DC immediately invested into the people we work alongside daily.

#### September Challange

In its fourth year, the 2023 September Challenge was a massive success! Together, we raised over \$72,000, with nearly 200 donations throughout the Challenge.We reached this successful milestone thanks to our AMAZING September Challenge Sponsors, Committee members, staff, volunteers, donors, event hosts & participants, fundraisers, and online auction partners & participants. Everyone played a vital role in ensuring this campaign's success. #### Bezos Day 1 Families Fund

In 2023, Everyone Home DC was honored to learn the Bezos Day 1 Families Fund selected us to receive a \$2.5 million multi-year grant. This private gift is the largest one ever received by Everyone Home DC. It is the sixth round of annual Day 1 Families Fund grants, recognizing leading organizations doing compassionate, needle-moving work to help families experiencing homelessness secure housing and stability.

"Everyone Home DC is honored and humbled to be selected by the Day 1 Families Fund to receive this incredibly significant support, the timing of which is transformative for our organization and the people we work alongside," said Karen Cunningham, Executive Director of Everyone Home DC. "We will put these critical funds right to work, increasing our organizational capacity and expanding our comprehensive services and housing solutions to ensure that families in our nation's capital have the safety and stability of housing, the foundation needed for them to thrive."

This one-time, uniquely flexible grant will support Everyone Home DC in serving as a critical lifeline to children and adults in families experiencing homelessness, who represent more than a quarter of the homeless population nationally. Everyone Home DC intends to use the Day 1 Families Fund grant to expand and enrich its comprehensive support services for families at risk of or experiencing homelessness to facilitate long-term positive change.

Everyone Home DC was selected as a Day 1 Families Fund grant recipient by national advisors who are leading advocates and experts on homelessness and service provision. National advisors brought expertise on housing justice, advancing racial equity, and helping programs employ resources effectively to assist families out of homelessness.





### Noma Run Club + Lost Generation Brewing Company + Everyone Home DC

When NoMa Run Club asked if Everyone Home DC was interested in joining a collaboration with Lost Generation Brewing Company in honor of their 2nd anniversary, we said, "Yes!" The result was the delicious limited edition brew "Mind is Everything" in a beautiful can that featured the NoMa Run Club and Everyone Home DC logos. All proceeds from sales at the "Mind is Everything" launch event went to Everyone Home DC, with a portion of continued sales going to our life-changing programs and services until supply ran out. In total, this charitable collaboration raised more than \$3.500! Everyone Home DC is incredibly humbled to work in partnership with our amazing local community.



## Target Circle + Everyone Home DC

Everyone Home DC was honored to be selected to participate in the Target Circle Giving Program. We received close to 216,000 votes and raised nearly \$5,000. # Everyone Home DC receives the Barbara Jordan Social Action Award

The award recognizes persons or organizations who are proponents of social justice through their advocacy, programs, and vision. In 2023, Everyone Home DC's institutional giving revenue included a one-time, \$2.5 million, 5-year grant from the Bezos Day 1 Families Fund. As required by Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), Everyone Home DC recorded the funds as income received in the 2023 fiscal year. Everyone Home DC will use the funds in accordance with the funding request for the next five years.
